SECTION 1

My organisation:

- is a local government within Western Australia
- is willing to sign and comply with the AWARE Grant Agreement (refer *Sample Grant Agreement*)
- should not be requesting funds from a more appropriate source
- does not have any non-compliant SEMC or DFES-funded projects (NDRP or AWARE)
- has the capacity to deliver this project
- has undertaken a project risk assessment for the delivery of this project

SECTION 2

My application:

- is requesting funding between \$2,500 and \$30,000 (local level risk assessment maximum \$4,000) - no GST applied
- is not requesting funds for a capital or asset purchase, or an upgrade or maintenance
- provides realistic timeframes and milestones
- has a credible and reasonable budget
- has realistic outputs and outcomes
- delivers outcomes for the community and does not provide a commercial advantage
- has endorsement from the Chief Executive Officer and Chief Financial Officer

SECTION 3

My project:

- aligns with one project category (refer *Guidelines for Applicants*)
- builds emergency management capacity or preparedness at a local level
- will not commence before the Grant Agreement is executed, or before 1 January 2021
- will become sustainable once completed
- would not be better being delivered by another agency
